The overview of the network bullet camera is shown below:

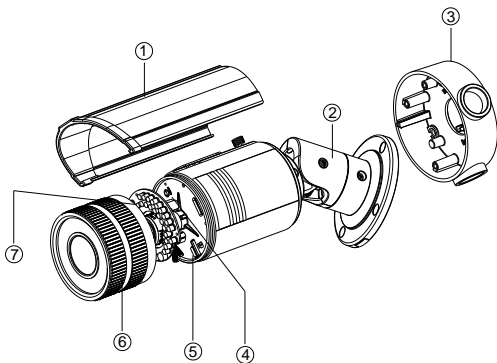


Figure 1-1 Overview

The wiring varies according to the different models of bullet camera.

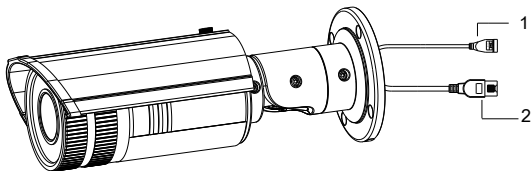


Figure 1-2 Wiring (A)

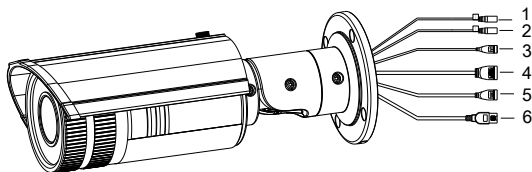


Figure 1-3 Wiring (B)

2 Installation

Before you start:

- Make sure the device in the package is in good condition and all the assembly parts are included.
- Make sure all the related equipment is power-off during the installation.
- Check the specification of the products for the installation environment.
- Make sure the power supply is matched with your required voltage to avoid damage.
- If the product does not function properly, please contact your dealer or the nearest service center. Do not disassemble the camera for repair or maintenance by yourself.
- Make sure that the wall is strong enough to withstand three times the weight of the camera.



For the camera that supports IR, you are required to pay attention to the following precautions to prevent IR reflection:

- Dust or grease on the dome cover will cause IR reflection. Please do not remove the dome cover film until the installation is finished. If there is dust or grease on the dome cover, clean the dome cover with clean soft cloth and isopropyl alcohol.

- Make sure that there is no reflective surface too close to the camera lens. The IR light from the camera may reflect back into the lens causing reflection.
- The foam ring around the lens must be seated flush against the inner surface of the bubble to isolate the lens from the IR LEDs. Fasten the dome cover to camera body so that the foam ring and the dome cover are attached seamlessly.

Steps:

1. Drill four screw holes in the wall according to the No.2 holes of the supplied drill template.

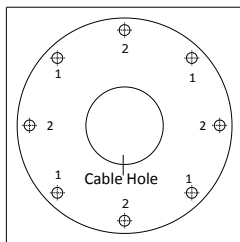


Figure 2-1 Drill Template

2. Drill one cable hole according to the drill template.



If you want to route the cables through the side of the junction box, you can skip this step.

3. Fix the junction box to the wall with the expansion screws.

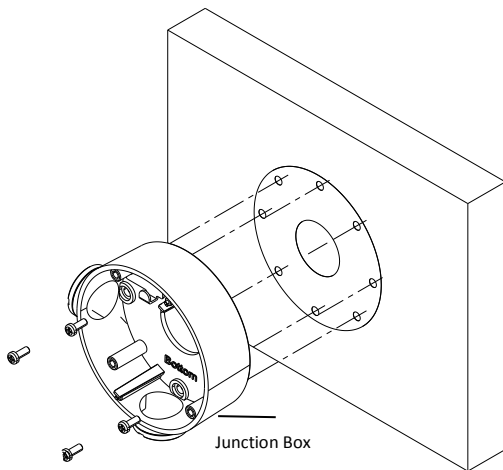


Figure 2-2 Install the Junction Box

4. Route the cables of the camera.
 - Route the cables through the junction box and the cable hole if there is a cable hole drilled on the ceiling.
 - Route the cables through the side outlet of the junction box to the surface of the ceiling if there is no cable hole drilled on the ceiling.

5. Hook the camera to the junction box with the safety rope.
6. Tighten the screws to fix the camera to the junction box.

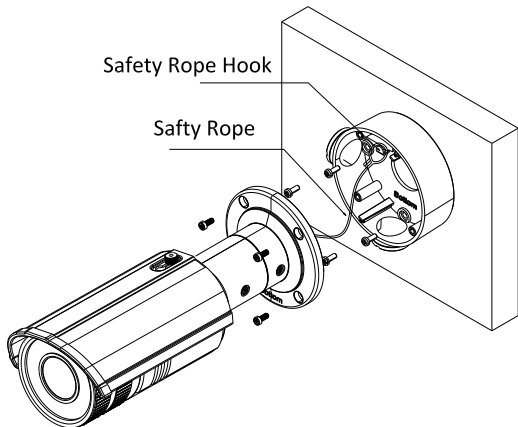


Figure 2-3 Fix the Camera to the Junction Box

7. Loosen the screws on the bracket to adjust the camera to the desired surveillance angle and then tighten the screws to fix the camera.

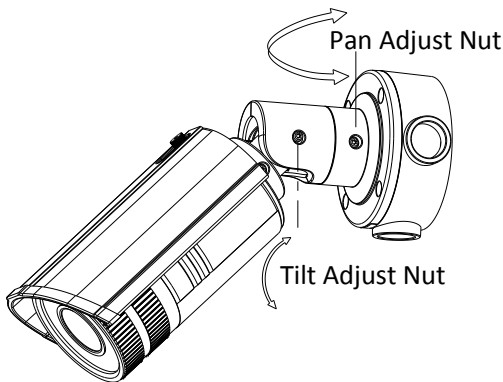


Figure 2-4 Adjust Monitoring Angle



- Please loosen the screws slightly until you can adjust the camera and do not remove the screws from the bracket.
8. Loosen the lock screw on the sun shield and remove the sun shield.
 9. Rotate to remove the front box from camera and adjust the zoom lever and focus lever to get a clear image.

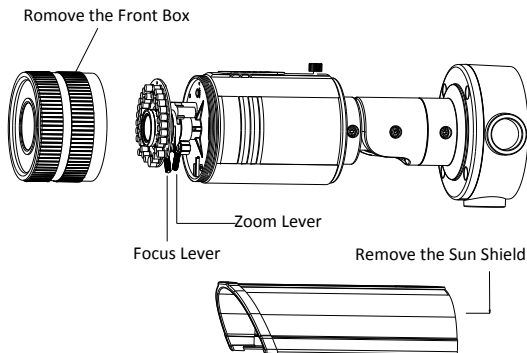


Figure 2-5 Lens Adjustment



For the device supports electronic lens, you can only adjust the camera to the proper surveillance angle via 3-axis adjustment, then adjust the zoom and focus by the PTZ control from the client software or web browser.

10. Reinstall the front box and the sun shield to finish the installation.



For some projects have strict demands on the water-proof, you may need to install a water-proof rubber case (purchased separately) to the foldable position of the bracket to protect it from water. See the figure below.

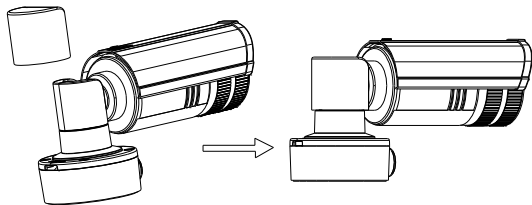


Figure 2-6 Install the Rubber Case

3 Setting the Network Camera over the LAN

Purpose:

To view and configure the camera via LAN (Local Area Network), you need to connect the network camera in the same subnet with your PC. Then, install the SADP or PCNVR software to search and change the IP of network camera.

- The following figure shows the cable connection of network camera and PC:

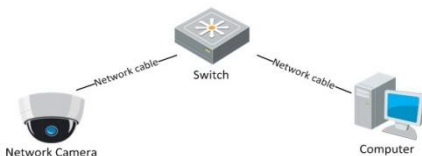


Figure 3-1 Wiring over LAN

- Set the IP address of the camera for accessing via LAN.

Steps:

1. To get the IP address, you can choose either of the following methods:

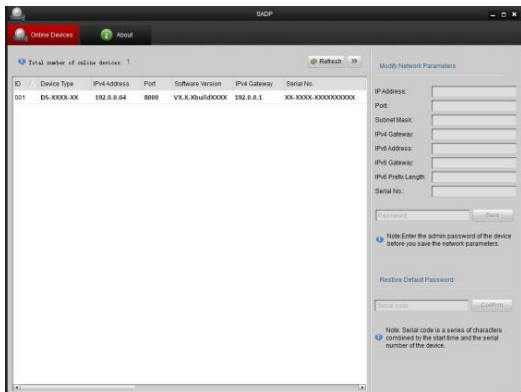



Figure 3-2 Search Online Devices

 - ☐ Use SADP, a software tool which can automatically detect network camera in the LAN and list the device information like IP address, subnet mask, port number, device serial number, device version, etc., shown in Figure 3-2.

- ☐ Use PCNVR software and to list the online devices. Please refer to the user manual of PCNVR client software for detailed information.
- 2. Change the IP address and subnet mask to the same subnet as of your PC.
Refer to the following introductions to set IP address with SADP software:

☐ **Search active devices online**

Search online devices automatically:

After launch the SADP software, it automatically searches the online devices every 15 seconds from the subnet where your computer locates. It displays the total number and information of the searched devices in the Online Devices interface. Device information including the device type, IP address, port number, gateway, etc. will be displayed.





Device can be searched and displayed in the list in 15 seconds after it goes online; it will be removed from the list in 45 seconds after it goes offline.

Search online devices manually:

You can also click  **Refresh** to refresh the online device list manually. The newly searched devices will be added to the list.



You can click  or  on each column heading to order the information; you can click  to show the device table and hide the network parameter panel on the right side, or click  to show the network parameter panel.

□ **Modify device information**

Steps:

- 1). Select the device to be modified in the device list as shown in Figure 3-3. The network parameters of the device will be displayed in the Modify Network Parameters panel on the right side as shown in Figure 3-4.
- 2). Edit the modifiable network parameters, e.g. IP address and port number.
- 3). Enter the password of the admin account of the device in the Password field and click **Save** to save the changes.

3. Enter the IP address of network camera in the address field of the web browser to view the live video.



- The default value of the IP address is “192.0.0.64”. The default user name is “admin”, and password is “12345”.
- For accessing the network camera from different subnets, please set the gateway for the network camera after you log in.

Steps:

1. Open the web browser.
2. In the browser address bar, input the IP address of the network camera, e.g., 192.0.0.64 and press the **Enter** key to enter the login interface.
3. Input the user name and password.
4. Click **Login**.

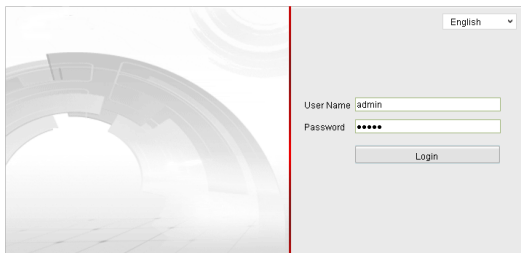


Figure 4-1 Login Interface

You may have to close the web browser to finish the installation of the plug-in.

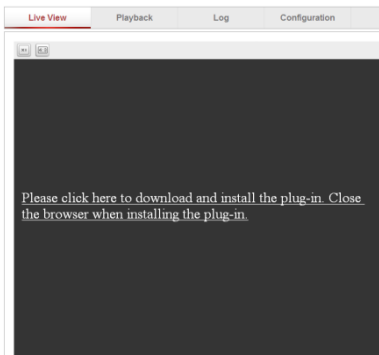


Figure 4-2 Download Plug-in

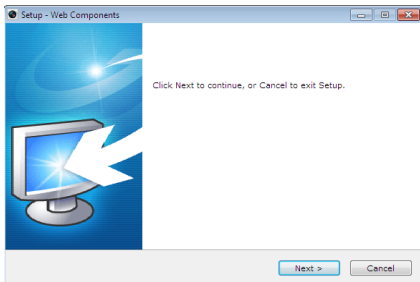


Figure 4-3 Install Plug-in (1)

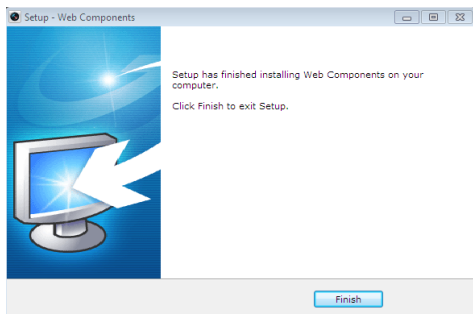


Figure 4-4 Install Plug-in (2)
